## Synopsis and objective

The main objective of the International Workshop on Intelligence-IWI 2012: "Analytic outreach: the new intelligence paradigm and the role of academic experts" is to bring together international experts in field of Intelligence to explore the issue of analytic outreach.

During the last decades, the development of policies of openness and engagement of the Intelligence Communities with individuals outside the IC, especially with universities, research centres and academic scholars, has become a practice of intelligence services in some countries.

From intelligence services' standpoint, Academia has emerged as a place to reach out for expertise and analytic insights for fulfilling the intelligence mission of producing actionable knowledge aimed at decision makers.

On the other hand, intelligence as a matter of academic study, research and teaching has evolved from a phase of introduction with the appearance of courses on intelligence and intelligence services in higher education, to a current situation in which universities have begun to offer postgraduate courses on intelligence analysis.

This fact might be leading to the rise of intelligence schools outside the IC, that present an opportunity for intelligence services for contrasting, enriching and improving their analytical practices.
