

Application information for Incoming Exchange Students in Summer Semester 2026

Application procedure and documents

Online Application

Nominated students will receive a weblink to the online portal Mobility Online from their respective International Office (Link).

Applicants must have been nominated by their International Office and must have completed their online application by the application deadline (October 31, 2025). The following documents have to be submitted in the portal:

- Learning Agreement (if possible OLA)
- Transcript of Records from home university
- Language Certificate for B1 or B2 (for German and/or English) depending on your course language(s)
- CV in English or German (needed for projects only)

Learning Agreement

ERASMUS+ students can go through the process of submitting an OLA or use the Learning Agreement (LA) form provided by their home institution, the first part of it ("Before the mobility"). Exchange students from countries not taking part in the ERASMUS+ program and from institutions not providing any document comparable to LA, please let me know.

Please fill in all courses you plan to take at Hochschule Ravensburg-Weingarten University (RWU) and the number of ECTS credits as indicated in LSF respectively our list of English-taught lectures. If you wish to do a project, please indicate it in the LA as well and let me know topics you are interested in, then I can get in touch with professors. You can also figure out a project after your arrival in Germany if your university is okay with that.

Upon receipt of your OLA/ LA, we will check if you meet the requirements for the lectures you chose and/or if a professor is ready to supervise your project. The (0)LA will be signed by the professor in charge and sent back to the International Office of your home university and you.

At the time of application, the selection of courses can only be a preliminary one, there will most likely be some changes when the semester begins. There may also be conflicts in the timetable or some courses might not meet your expectations. It could also be the case that for whatever reason the desired course is not offered or is cancelled shortly before or after the semester start (e.g. this can happen with CLIC courses when the number of participants turns out to be too small). However, we try our best to keep you updated and you will have enough time to make changes to your Learning Agreement during the first weeks you are here.

Upon request, we can arrange a consultation with a professor, who could help you to make your final decision regarding lectures and projects. Of courses you can also always consult the International Office/ Incoming Coordinator. Changes in the course selection then need to be documented in the second part of the (O)LA form ("During the mobility") and are signed by all parties again.

Transcript of Records

A "Transcript of Records" is an official document, issued by your home university, listing all courses you have already taken showing the credits earned and the grades obtained. If possible, it should also list the courses you are taking at present (even if not graded yet). Please note, however, that we can only accept transcripts in English or German language.

Language Certificate

If you plan to attend German-taught courses, your application has to include a proof of sufficent knowledge in German. If you plan to attend English-taught courses only, please also provide a language certificate for English. In order to participate a course in German or English your language skills have to be **at least** on level B1 as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) in both languages at the time you arrive here, but we highly recommend level B2.

Native speakers do not need to submit any language certificate.

CV - Curriculum vitae

Housing/Room in a dormitory

Please indicate in your application if you would like to get a dorm room in Weingarten, right on Campus. The international office has a fixed number of rooms in two dorms on Campus which are reserved for International Exchange students.

Studentenwerk Weiße Rose e.V. operates two student dormitories in Weingarten:

- Dormitory at Briachstr. 10: There are up to 24 single rooms per floor (12 per north and south wing) plus kitchen and common space for all students. Two adjacent single rooms share a common bathroom. The monthly rent amounts to € 280.
- Dormitory at Briachstr. 2, (opened in September 2015): four students share an apartment (two intl. students live together with two German students). The monthly rent amounts to € 360.

You need to indicate your interest in a room with your application to International Office but the rental contract is closed between the student and the Weiße Rose dormitory upon arrangement by the Incoming Coordinator. You do not need to do anything else until you are otherwise informed.

Visa Information for Non-EU students studying at one of our partner universities in the EU

Non-EU citizens who are enrolled at an EU university (except Ireland, and Denmark) do not need to apply for a German residence permit if they study in Germany for less than 360 days (i.e. two semesters) according to the EU directive 2016/801, "REST-directive" for researchers and students.

However, students need to follow a certain process and hand in several documents to the International Office of the partner university as soon as they have received their letter of acceptance. The process can take up to a month and students should only come to Germany after the receipt of the certificate. Students applying from a third country should please get in touch with our International Office and will be provided with the necessary information as to what they need to do.

Study options for exchange students

You are welcome to spend one or two semesters at our university and have the option to

- **attend courses:** you can take any course from any study program if you fulfil the respective requirements. Please note: Most study programs are taught in German, but there is a huge offer of English-taught courses as well (see below or the attached list)
- do project work, if you apply successfully (either before your arrival or when you are already here)
 for a project on offer (see below or the attached list)
- do both.

Information about courses is provided in the university information system LSF.




- Please click on the English flag on the top right-hand side for the page in English. There are several ways
 you can search for courses you are interested in. You will have access to the current and the previous
 semester.
- !! The <u>final course offer</u> of for the upcoming semester is published only shortly before the semester start, but generally in each summer and winter semesters similar courses are offered as in the previous ones. So, the list attached to my Email is a provisional one for the corresponding semester which is updated continuously until semester start but it gives you an overview about the courses available in English without having to search through LSF!!
- When you click on *Course overview* you will find the <u>University course catalogue</u> of the current semester with a list of lectures for each study program.




Please select the study program/s you are interested in and click until you obtain the detailed description of the individual lecture, seminar or practical training.

• Alternatively, you can click on Search for lectures (Link) in order to find specific lectures you are interested in. Please click on "summer semester" to get a glimpse of the courses taking place during the summer semester...



• There is an entry in the <u>University course catalogue</u> called <u>Fremdsprachen/Language courses</u> (all faculties). Here you will find a broad range of language and intercultural courses, offered by our Centre for Languages and Intercultural Communication (CLIC) – the general language courses are offered every semester while other courses that are offered might vary. Students from all study programs can take part in as many of these courses as they like and can manage. For all language courses you will obtain the specified number of credits if you pass the varied types of exams (oral, written etc.) taking place throughout the semester and if your attendance was 100%.



Attention: The German language courses on levels A1 – B2 start with a placement test and a few days of "refreshing your German" prior to the beginning of the lecture period, the attendance of which is compulsory!

English-taught courses

Study programs at our university are taught in German, with some exceptions:

- Bachelor program in Electrical Engineering and Information Technology, taught in English during the first two years (Semester 1 – 4)
- E-Mobility and Green Energy, taught in English during the first two years (Semester 1 4)

- Bachelor in Mechatronics, taught entirely in English from semester 1 7 started in the summer semester 2025 (NEW)
- Bachelor Program in International Project Management (international variant of the German bachelor
 Mechanical Engineering taught in English during the first two years (Semester 1 4)
- Master program in Electrical Engineering and Embedded Systems, taught entirely in English
- Master program in Mechatronics, taught entirely in English.
- <u>International Academy</u>: The International Academy provides students the opportunity to complete a one or two-semester interdisciplinary study program in English. The program was established more than ten years ago by the Faculty of Technology and Management and is currently offering interdisciplinary study courses covering theoretical frameworks as well as practical approaches taught by both international academics and industrial experts. You can combine the courses with courses from any other study program
- The offer for exchange students is completed by courses/ seminars run by the Center for Languages and Intercultural Communication (CLIC). They comprise German courses on levels A1 up to C1, a large variety of English and other language courses as well as intercultural trainings.

Project work

If you prefer to do some kind of project work at our university, please let me know a range of topics you are interested in (prioritized) and provide a CV including background, skills and interests with your application. I will inquire and identify potential topics and professors/ supervisors at RWU and provide them with your CV and transcript.

Once I identified one of several projects which might fit, I will bring you in touch with the corresponding professor/ supervisor for further discussion (time frame, scope, results, ECTS needed etc. It is also possible to decide on a project after your arrival in the first few weeks of the semester.

Important dates and deadlines

Application Deadline: October 31, 2025

By this date, applicants should have been nominated by the International Office of their home university AND they should have completed their online application. We have no specific nomination deadline so please nominate your students any time prior to the application deadline. (If you think you are going to be a little late with your application you are free to ask if we still have some empty spots.....)

Arrival: from 02.03.2026

Welcome & Orientation Days: March 2-13, 2026 (to be confirmed)

From Monday, March 2 until Friday, March 13 our Welcome & Orientation Days will take place which will help you settle in, cope with bureaucracy and get familiar with Ravensburg/ Weingarten and the region where you are going to live for the months to come. During these days all important formalities will be completed (enrolment, registration at the municipality, health insurance); therefore, it is highly re-commended and vital to get here in time.

German language course:

The university offers free German languages courses throughout the whole semester (4hrs twice weekly) for the German levels A1, A2, B1, B2. on Wednesday and Friday mornings from 09:45 – 13:00 in presence. (No other lecture taught in English will take place during those two periods)

Before the lecture period starts there will be a placement test for those with some German knowledge and a couple of recap/ refresher days for your German (both compulsory).

The German course in C1 will take place online throughout the lecture period. In addition to the German course a tutorial and other support offers are taking place.

You can complete one level of German per semester A1, A2, B1, B2 and will be granted 4 ECTS (80% attendance). For C1 you will get 5 ECTS. The German courses are taught by professional language instructors from the CLIC language centre and are free of charge. (this applies to all other language courses too!)

Since at least a basic knowledge of the German language and an awareness of German culture are essential for your well-being and integration here, participation is highly recommended!
