Semester Workload	30 ECTS credits (= European Credit Transfer System) 1 ECTS per term is equivalent to 25-30 hours of studying. Telecom SudParis expects partner students to study full-time and pass courses with good grades.	
Language of Instruction	French and English. TSP offers more than 11 Master's programs fully in English. Preferred language of instruction must be confirmed during application process.	
FLE Courses	Complimentary weekly French language courses (FLE) are provided to international students during the semester. Intensive French session is also organized during late summer. <u><i>Note: To facilitate integration to France, FLE intensive program organized in September is mandatory to all non-French speaking dual degree-seeking students.</i></u>

The nominated student(s) will be receiving an email notification containing the application link prior to the application deadline. The following documents will need to be provided during the application process:

- Online Form/Application
- One-page letter of motivation/statement of purpose (either in French or English)
- Curriculum Vitae (either in French or English)
- Copy of valid passport or National ID
- A study plan of the courses (exchanges only)
- A recent passport style picture
- Transcript of records (Bachelor grades for M1 program; Bachelor & Master 1 grades for M2 program) (either in French or English)
- Language proficiency certificate based on the type of courses or program (can be issued by home institution)
- Recommendation letter(s) (optional)

Application results	Application results will be ready usually within six weeks after the application deadline.
Exchange Admission Requirements	Students must have validated at least 120 ECTS for L3 level courses, 180 ECTS for M1 level courses and 240 ECTS for M2 level courses.
Double-Degree Admission Requirements	<p>Masters of Science: students must have validated at least 120 ECTS for L3 program, 180 ECTS for M1 program and 240 ECTS for M2 program.</p> <p>Master's in Engineering: students must have validated at least 180 ECTS for L3 program or 240 ECTS for M1 program.</p> <p><i>Note: double-degree admission into M2 is not available.</i></p>
Language Proficiency	Partner students will need either an official language test certificate or a certificate of from their home institution stating that they have sufficient language skills to study in English (at least level B2 of the CEFR) and/or French (at least level B2 of the CEFR) in their chosen program. For programs taught in English, students whose native language is English are exempt from the language proficiency requirement.

There are also local grocery and convenience stores nearby.</p>

Visa Requirements

EU Students	<p>Citizens of EU members States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland do not need a visa for France.</p>
Non-EU Students	<p>Non-European students must apply for long stay student visa (4 months to one year).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• “<i>Etudes en France</i>” procedure (Studying in France). Students coming from a country concerned by this process will have to create an online account from the website “<i>Etudes en France</i>”.

Financial requirement The French authorities require a financial guarantee of €615 per month in order to issue a visa (7380€ for a year).

Health Insurance

EU Students Citizens of EU members States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland are not required to enroll in the French National Healthcare IF they have a **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)**. The EHIC must be valid until the end of their stay. EHIC will allow students to get their healthcare expenses reimbursed under the same conditions as if they were in their home country. EHIC should be obtain prior to arrival in France. European students who do not hold an EHIC must apply for the French National Healthcare like other international students.

Non-EU Students Enrolment in the French National Healthcare known as « *Sécurité Sociale* » is free and compulsory. This allows students to benefit from a partial reimbursement of healthcare costs, on average 60%. The entire enrolment process takes place online once the visa has been issued and a French bank account has been opened.
