<b>What kind of language test certificate and/or level is required</b>	<p><b>To study at Sciences Po Grenoble, students must prove B2 level in French or English</b></p> <p><b>Track 1: B2 in English</b>  <b>Track 2: B2 in English and B2 in French (if students want to study classes taught in French). The FEIS class requires B1 French.</b>  <b>Track 3: B2+ in French</b></p>	
<b>Is course registration done before arrival?</b>	<p>Yes, in September and January - online  The students will receive an email link to the app just before registration opens.</p>	
<b>Are there any areas of study or department that are restricted to exchange students ?</b>	<p>Students cannot study for “ateliers” or “séminaires”  Master’s level students should contact us before selecting their programme.</p>	
<b>Will Exchange students belong to 1 Department?</b>	<p>Exchange students are Sciences Po students, but have access to courses in other departments of the University Grenoble Alpes (UGA) (maximum 2 per semester).  <a href="#">Programs</a></p>	
<b>Learning agreements</b>	<p>Students must submit a before learning agreement before arrival by email. Then they will submit a during learning agreement if any course changes are necessary.</p>	

## Student Application

Shortly after students are nominated, they will be invited by email to fill in the application form online and they will receive useful information in order to prepare their stay in Grenoble. We will ask them to upload on their applicant page the following documents:

- A copy of the passport or identity card,
- An identity photo (passport size),
- the last year's transcripts
- A copy of the European Health Insurance Card (only for European Students)
- A screenshot of the Altissia test that will give us the student's level of French <https://altissia.org/fr/test-niveau-francais-gratuit/> and/or English <https://altissia.org/free-english-language-test/>
- Beginners in French or English can upload a sworn statement explaining that he/she is a beginner
- A native speaker doesn't need to provide the test

## Travel, housing, insurance and practical matters

<p><b>Housing</b></p>	<p>Is housing guaranteed for incoming exchange students?</p> <p>Is housing guaranteed for Free Movers?</p>	<p><b>Yes</b></p> <p>Students registered as part of an exchange program will have their application considered by ISSO Studenthousing. After the student online application, SciencesPo IR Office sends to ISSO Studenthousing the student contact details and ISSO Studenthousing will send the online registration procedure to the student by email (details of choices of accommodation, deadlines for application, etc) in order to get accommodation in a residence hall.</p> <p><a href="#">Accommodation - Crous international</a></p> <p><a href="#">International</a></p> <p><b>No</b></p> <p><b>Free Mover students need to find an accommodation in the private sector.</b></p>
	<p>Will incoming exchange students need to pay fees for their housing?</p>	<p>Yes, it will cost approximately 200 € to 600€/month (200 € for very basic accommodation)</p>
<p><b>Is the application form for housing available on-line?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Yes</li> <li>• Every student will receive an email from Student housing in order to apply for accommodation online</li> <li>• Online <b>application deadline</b> for accommodation is : <b>May 31st if the student arrival is in September</b> <b>November 15th if the student arrival is in January</b></li> </ul>

<p><b>Students of other countries</b></p> <p><b>Will have 2 options</b></p>	<p><b>1/ Sign up for private health insurance in his/her country of origin before arriving in France</b></p> <p>This option enables you to be covered in France as soon as you arrive and will save you time once you get here.</p> <p><b>2/ You have a long-stay visa serving as a residence permit (VLS-TS, visa long séjour valant titre de séjour) bearing the word “étudiant”, or a temporary long stay visa (VLS-T) marked "dispense temporaire de carte de séjour":</b></p> <p>Before arriving in France, and before completing registration with the French social security system, we recommend you take out travel insurance or private health insurance to ensure you are covered during the first weeks of your stay in France. When you arrive in France and once you receive your student card at SciencesPO, you must register on the ‘Assurance Maladie’ (French health insurance) website for international students to ensure your healthcare costs are covered by the general health insurance system (CPAM) :</p> <p><a href="https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/">https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/</a></p> <p>The website <a href="https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr">etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr</a> is available in French and in English. Registration is free and you will not need to pay social security contributions</p>
