FLE – French course	Courses where non-French speaking students are gathered in small groups to learn the basics of the French language through written and, above all, oral exercises. These courses are offered to all exchange students.
Grading system	The ENS de Lyon uses the <i>European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System</i> (ECTS) which is a workload-based system for measuring and comparing study results. The student is awarded a certain number of ECTS credits for each course that reflects the workload necessary to successfully complete a course. Credits are awarded only when the student has fulfilled the course requirements, for example regular attendance. The credits are allocated by the individual departments in accordance with the standard workload determined by the respective study and examination.
Welcome week	ENS de Lyon hosts a dedicated "Discovery & Integration week" for all our international students during the last week of August. This is a free of charge integration week. Different activities are offered, such as campus tours, administrative information booth, cultural activities, sightseeing visits, and intensive French classes (from A1 to B2 level). Thematic workshops will be organized, regarding for example: enrolment finalization, bank and insurance, medical services, etc.
