APPLICATION

Nomination: Nominations can be sent via our Mobility Online platform or by sending an email to mob-in@imt-atlantique.fr before 20th April (Fall semester) or 20th October (Spring semester)



Application: Following the nomination an email will be sent to the students with additional information and log-in access to our application form on our Mobility Online platform, for completion and submission before May 1st (Fall semester) or November 1st (Spring semester)



Required documents to be uploaded on our platform:

ID photo, Copy of your passport, Resume (CV) + cover letter, Recommendation letter (optional), Transcripts of Records, Copy of degree (if any), Proof of French and/or English level, List of courses in progress

Decision: Decision on admission will be sent within 6 weeks after application deadlines

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Study level requirements: Students must have validated 3 years at university level; very exceptionally, we can accept students having validated only 2 years. **GPA requirement:** 3/4 minimum

Language requirements:

- For modules taught in French: B1 (participation in our French Summer School is mandatory for double degree students if they cannot submit an official certificate of a B1 level of French in June. Only DELF or TCF will be accepted. The four competencies have to be evaluated. We cannot accept letters from Language departments)
- For modules taught in English: B2

Credits obtained: 30 credits ECTS per semester

Estimated budget: Average budget: around 700 ~ 900 euros/month for living expenses (food & singleroom accommodation...) depending on the campus (Brest, Nantes, Rennes)

Health insurance (compulsory):

- For European students: European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)
- For non-European students: Health care expenses can be reimbursed by the French Social Security system

To be covered at least the first 2 months of their stay in France, we highly recommend students to purchase a private health insurance before leaving their home country. It takes some time to be registered by the French Social Security System

Complementary insurance: For a higher reimbursement rate, it is highly recommended to take out an additional medical insurance (around 20€/month)

Civil liability (compulsory): Civil liability and repatriation (around 20€/year)

Student life and campus contribution (CVEC): Every student pursuing a diploma in a higher education institution must obtain a certificate of payment of the CVEC
