Language requirements	<p>Students who want to participate in master's courses will need to provide proof of sufficient English language level. For exchange students we will accept a certificate of level B2 or C1 of the</p>

	<p><u>Common European Framework of Reference</u>. Other certificates that suffice are TOEFL internet-based with a score 90 or more, IELTS 6.5 or more, CPE (all grades), CAE with grades A, B, C or C+). TOEIC with a score of 720 or more for listening and reading and a score of 310 or more for speaking and writing)</p> <p>Validity period certificates Certificates of level B2 (CEFR) -Certificates older than 2 years will not be accepted. -Certificates need to be valid for the whole duration of the exchange. -Only certificates of level B2 issued by an official language institute or an official English teacher will be accepted. -Certificates or statements signed by an international officer will not be accepted.</p> <p>Certificate of level C1 (CEFR) -Certificates older than 3 years will not be accepted. -Certificates need to be valid for the whole duration of the exchange. -Only certificates of level C1 issued by an official language institute or an official English teacher will be accepted. -Certificates or statements signed by an international officer will not be accepted.</p> <p>Native speakers and students taking their degree programme in English are exempted (be it that visa requirements with regard to language level may apply and cannot be exempted). However, students taking their degree programme entirely in English at their home university need to upload proof of this (official transcript/ list of grades or statement of the international Relations Office of their home university on which is clearly stated that the student is following his/ her degree programme entirely in English).</p> <p>In our small scale system, a good level of English is required for our English taught bachelor's courses as well. The very last resits will take place by the end of June/ beginning of July. This means if necessary students must be in Maastricht to take a resit exam as planned in the examination-schedule. Unfortunately, the Examination Board of the Faculty of Law at Maastricht University does not permit students to take a resit at the student's home university.</p>

<p>Housing</p>	<p>Housing can be arranged with Maastrichthousing on www.maastrichthousing.com</p> <p>Reservations are made on a 'first come, first served' basis.</p> <p>Warning It is up to the student to try and find a room on the private market, but if so then keep the following in mind:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - ALWAYS check whether the address of the room/apartment offered actually exists (via google maps, for example); only too often people try to make a fast buck by renting out rooms that do not, in fact, exist. - NEVER transfer money in advance! No matter how desperate you are, always check the credentials of the person subletting the room. <p>The faculty does not act as an intermediary, so students need to make their own reservation. Please note that the International Relations Office of The Faculty of Law of Maastricht University cannot and will not interfere on your behalf in case of problems, issues or even legal disputes, neither with the UM Guesthouse, Maastrichthousing, nor with housing agencies, landlords, local students subletting their room or apartment or otherwise.</p>
