Minimum English Requirement	We do not require any tests proving level of English language but nominated students are required to have sufficient knowledge of English in order to attend the classes. Necessary level: B2 (CEFR, Common European Frame Work of Reference for Language)
Language Courses	Basic Swedish language courses run part time and as evening classes throughout the semester for 7.5 academic ECTS credit. http://www.nordiska.uu.se/admissions/courses/swedish/basic/ The language courses above are free of charge for exchange students.
Student visa and residence permit	<ul> <li>Non-EU citizens:</li> <li>Some non-EU citizens need to apply for a visa to enter Sweden and all non-EU citizens need to apply for a residence permit to stay longer than 90 days.</li> <li>Uppsala University will send a Letter of Acceptance by e-mail to each student requiring the document. The Letter of Acceptance is necessary in order to apply for a visa/residence permit. Further information can be found here: <a href="https://www.migrationsverket.se/English/Private-individuals/Studying-and-researching-in-Sweden.html">https://www.migrationsverket.se/English/Private-individuals/Studying-and-researching-in-Sweden.html</a></li> <li>As of 2022, non-EU citizens need to visit a Swedish embassy to identify themselves as part of the application process for a residence permit.</li> <li>Please note: Non-EU citizens currently studying in another country covered by the Schengen agreement still have to apply for a residence permit before their arrival in Sweden.</li> </ul>
Financial supporting documentation	For non-EU/EEA citizens the Swedish Migration Board requires that applicants support their visa/residence permit application with proof of sufficient funds for their entire time of stay. Please see Swedish Migration Agency for requirements.
Medical Insurance	All students are insured by the insurance Student IN from Kammarkollegiet. This insurance provides emergency medical and dental coverage, home transport, personal property coverage, third party liability and legal protection. It provides coverage for the student's travel directly to and from Sweden, from two weeks prior to and two weeks after the official term dates. Arrival days and Orientation Week	For the autumn term, the recommended days of arrival usually fall on Thursday, Friday and Saturday one week prior to the start of term whereas the spring term's recommended days of arrival usually are Friday and Saturday on the weekend prior to term start. Each semester there is an orientation program for new students taking place prior to the start of the semester. <u>www.uu.se/welcome</u>

Accommodation	Uppsala University offers accommodation for exchange students through the contracted private company The Uppsala University Housing Office, but housing is not guaranteed. The application for housing is submitted during May 15 <sup>th</sup> – May 31st (for autumn) and November 15th – November 30th (for spring). Students with disabilities	Support for reading and writing difficulties/dyslexia, mental disorders, neuropsychiatric disorders, hearing impairment, visual impairment, physical disabilities or chronic illnesses can be provided. To receive support students must provide evidence of disability directly to the Uppsala University's disability coordinators.
	The type of support received is directly related to the education and according to needs. Support is planned in collaboration with the student. Student Health Services	The Student Health Services is a team of specialists such as psychologists and counsellors, all focused on student related mental health issues, such as stress etc. Students can receive counselling and take part in a variety of workshops. Please note that there is no general practitioner for medical and dental issues or emergencies available at the Student Health Services.

Once a member of a nation, the Nation Card is also valid as a Student ID card.
