Teaching methods:	Lectures, tutorials, seminars. There will be approximately 12 hours of lectures per week. There will also be tutorials and/or seminars.
Assessment methods:	Exams, assignments. Assessment takes a variety of forms. Usually there will be a combination of written exams and coursework.
Pass mark:	The pass mark at Cardiff is 40%
Average credits that students take per academic year:	FULL YEAR OF STUDY: 120 UK credits. The normal course load would be 6 modules (of 20 credits each) ONE SEMESTER OF STUDY: 60 UK credits. The normal course load would be 6 modules (of 10 credits each) 1 UK credit = 0.5 ECTs
Academic Information	It is preferable for incoming exchange students to study modules in Cardiff Business School relating to Business, Economics, Finance etc. It is also possible for exchange students to take modules which are listed in the 'Exchange Student Module Catalogue' and the 'Free Standing module catalogue'. They can usually also take courses in the Centre for Lifelong Learning. Usually 40 credits can be taken from outside the Business School.

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Student support and services:

University services available to exchange students:	There is a wide range of services at Cardiff University for all students. Some of them include: Students Union, Student Advisory Service, Student Counseling Service, the Disability Dyslexia Resource Centre, Sports facilities, libraries, student societies, International Development.
Library / internet facilities on campus:	Our 18 library sites are conveniently located close to the academic schools they support and offer a wide range of information resources, as well as access to photocopying and IT facilities. Students will also have access to the University's high speed network upon enrolment. The Aberconway Library provides information services for Cardiff Business School. 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Accommodation:

University Residences	The Residences Office hopes to be able to provide university residences to all exchange students who are studying at Cardiff University for the full academic year. There are a number of Halls of Residence and Student Houses to choose from, offering catered, part-catered and self-catered residences. Around 70% of residences are en-suite, which means that each study bedroom has its own bathroom. Standard residences have shared bathroom facilities, which are shared between 4 and 8 people. Self-catered residences have communal kitchen areas to prepare food. The Residences Office cannot guarantee "part session" (i.e. one semester only) students a place in University residences, but it is advisable to also seek accommodation in the private sector. Students staying for the Autumn semester only can join the central international office "house hunting programme" in mid- September. Other housing options	There is also accommodation available in the private sector. However, some landlords may be reluctant to offer short-term tenancy agreements so it is important to research carefully. The Residences Office maintains regularly updated lists of flats and shared houses. The list is available from https://www.cardiff.ac.uk/study/accommodation/postgraduates/private-sector The Student Advisory Service can help students with any private accommodation concerns and can give advice on what to consider when thinking about renting private accommodation. It is recommended that students come to Cardiff before their period of study commences in order to look for suitable accommodation.
Accommodation fees	The accommodation costs compare very favorably with those of other UK universities. A National Union of Students survey found Cardiff University to charge some of the lowest fees in the UK.



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Healthcare:

Council Tax	If you are studying at Cardiff Business School for less than 24 weeks, you will need to send Cardiff City Council a letter from your home university confirming that you are on a full time programme of study. You will also need a Council Tax letter from Cardiff University, confirming that your time studying here is part of a full time programme in your home country. You will need to manually request this letter from the University. Medical Healthcare	 Exchange students studying in the UK for longer than six months are entitled to free medical healthcare under the NHS (National Health Service), which includes consulting a doctor/General Practitioner (GP) and most other GP services; the treatment in a hospital (both emergency and non-emergency treatment); and prescription medication. (Prescription medication is free in Wales but not throughout the UK). Please note that certain services (e.g.vaccinations, sickness notes) are chargeable. Exchange Students coming to Cardiff for less than six months are not entitled to free medical treatment and should take out health insurance. All exchange students <u>must register</u> with a GP (doctor) close to the university.
