What are the course requirements?	<p><u>English Requirements</u> B2 Level of English (Equiv 6.0 IELTS Score with minimum 5.5 in every component) evidenced by an approved English language test</p> <p><u>Prerequisites</u> Some courses/modules may require prerequisites; the requirements are clearly stated on the course and module information sent to students.</p> <p><u>Visas and immigration</u> Students will need to adhere to the relevant immigration requirements for a UK visa which may differ from our minimum requirement. Standard Visitor Visa allows students to come to the UK for a short period of time (up to 6 months), such as to participate in an exchange programme. Some nationalities will need to apply in advance for a Standard Visitor Visa. You cannot extend a visitor</p>											

	<p>visa nor switch into a different visa category in the UK while on a Standard Visitor visa.</p> <p><u>Important update about Brexit and visas</u> Please note that visa requirements for EU nationals coming to study in the UK have changed. Visa required depends on students' length of stay. Students nominated for Semester 1 only will not be able to extend their mobility to Full Academic Year. This will be carried out by the ISC team who will contact you prior to enrolment to guide you through this process.</p>
