Considerations

Below you will find a list of considerations that you have to take into account before nominating your students:

- Students must be nominated by the home institution (except for free movers).
- All exchange students can take courses in different areas as long as they are of the same level of studies.
- Students cannot enroll undergraduate and graduate courses at the same time.
- Students can enroll between 4 and 6 courses per semester. The maximum percentage of cancellation of courses per semester is 40%. All students must present their learning agreement at the beginning of the semester.



What language level do students require?

If students take courses taught in **Spanish**, they must present a minimum level of B2 in Spanish. For courses taught in **English** no certificate needed

What documents do the students need for applying?

- Copy of the biographical page of the passport (HQ/scanned)
- International Health insurance (presented in the orientation day)
- CV (graduate students)
- Student photo / Booklet

These documents will be requested from students directly after nomination. Universities do not have to send them.

Sports:

Housing

EAFIT does not have student residences. Each student is responsible for finding and hiring a space to stay. We advise students resolving concerns and guiding them according to the needs and desired locations. In this regard, we provide a document with accommodation options close to the campus so they can choose their best option.

The owners of these accommodations do not have any agreement/contract with the university. **EAFIT is not responsible** for damages between the tenant and the landlord.

Living cost

Single room or shared apartments:

200 USD - 350 USD per month. The cost will depend on the facilities of the place and the proximity to the campus.

Food on campus:

- Daily menu: 3 USD - 3.5 USD
- Other meals: 4 USD - 5 USD

Transport:

- Bus/metro: 0.7 USD
- Taxi/Uber: 3 USD - 5.5USD (depending on the routes)

VISA/ PID stamp

If the student is from the Schengen Area and would like to stay in Colombia for a maximum of 180 days, he/she is not required to apply for a visa. The student can enter the country by showing the PID Letter and the acceptance letter provided by us.
