The University is comprised of five colleges, dozens of academic departments, interdisciplinary institutes, and research centers that attract students and faculty from around the world.

The University rests lightly on the site of old Ben Thompson's farm, where some 15,000 students and hundreds of faculty and staff live and work amid the lush forests, rolling hills, and riverbeds of one of the most beautiful campuses in the nation.
