Local credits to obtain a bachelor's degree	A minimum study of 7 semesters and not more than 16 semesters, with a total of 124 credits and an average GPA of 2.00, are required to be eligible for a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics.

Thai language course	Students may take language courses on a fee-paying basis in one of the numerous language schools in Bangkok.
Accommodation	The EBA program assists in arranging accommodation. Subject to availability incoming students may stay at CU iHouse , which is located within walking distance to the Faculty of Economics. Students also may stay at serviced apartment in Bangkok.
Visa	Before coming to Thailand, you must obtain a non-immigrant visa category ED from the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in your country. Information about immigration matters is available on the website at https://www.thaiembassy.org/
Health insurance	All students are recommended to purchase adequate health and liability insurance prior to their departure. Once students have arrived in Thailand, they will be required to pay a group health insurance fee of 2,000 baht per academic year.

<p>Student uniform</p>	<p>EBA students have to wear the following uniform:</p> <p><u>Female students:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shirt: with sleeves and collar, made out of pure white cloth with no design and of an appropriate thickness • Skirt: knee-length, made out of dark blue or black cloth with no design • Shoes: polite style, with a strap around the ankle <p><u>Male students:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shirt: white with sleeves and collar, no design • Trousers: long, made out of black or dark blue cloth, polite style with no design • Socks • Shoes: dark dress shoes
<p>Buddy system</p>	<p>To help students in their adjustment to campus life in Thailand and the Thai culture, the EBA runs a buddy system in which foreign students are paired with EBA students.</p>
<p>Living expenses</p>	<p>We estimate that your living expenses will be around THB 20,000 per month (3 meals per day, transportation costs, and personal expenses), excluding accommodation and luxury items.</p>
