Students can take courses offered by the EBA and, in addition, one course from another faculty or program.

### Exams

Students must work on assignments and/or take exams by the end of each semester. There are no resit exams.

### English Test

Students from partner universities are required to submit one of the following documents:

- A confirmation letter from the home university stating that the student's English proficiency is equivalent to B2 level or higher, or
- Official English proficiency test scores (e.g., TOEFL or IELTS) equivalent to B2 level or higher.

### Local credits to obtain a bachelor's degree

A minimum study of 7 semesters and not more than 16 semesters, with a total of 127 credits and an average GPA of 2.00, is required to be eligible for a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics.

## Further Information

<b>Thai language course</b>	Students may take language courses on a fee-paying basis in one of the numerous language schools in Bangkok.
<b>Accommodation</b>	The EBA program assists in arranging accommodation. Subject to availability, incoming students may stay at <a href="#">CU iHouse</a> , which is located within walking distance of the Faculty of Economics. Students may stay at a serviced apartment in Bangkok, such as Nonsi Residence or Hampton Residence.
<b>Visa</b>	Before coming to Thailand, you must obtain a <b>non-immigrant visa category ED</b> from the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in your country. Information about immigration matters is available on the website at <a href="https://www.thaiembassy.org/">https://www.thaiembassy.org/</a>
<b>Health insurance</b>	All students are <b>required</b> to purchase adequate health and liability insurance before their departure.  Once students have arrived in Thailand, they will be required to pay a group health insurance fee of 2,000 baht per academic year.
<b>Student uniform</b>	EBA students must wear the following uniform:  <u>Female students:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Shirt: with sleeves and collar, made out of pure white cloth with no design, and of an appropriate thickness</li><li>• Skirt: knee-length, made out of dark blue or black cloth with no design</li><li>• Shoes: polite style, with a strap around the ankle</li></ul> <u>Male students:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Shirt: white with sleeves and collar, no design</li><li>• Trousers: long, made out of black or dark blue cloth, a polite style with no design</li><li>• Socks</li><li>• Shoes: dark dress shoes</li></ul>
<b>Buddy system</b>	To help students in their adjustment to campus life in Thailand and the Thai culture, the EBA runs a buddy system in which foreign students are paired with EBA students.

## Living expenses

We estimate that your living expenses will be around THB 20,000 per month (3 meals per day, transportation costs, and personal expenses), excluding accommodation and luxury items.
