To obtain a minor, the student must complete 24 credits from a group of minor-related courses.

Applied ethics	The minor in <i>Applied ethics</i> will allow you to deepen your capacity for analysis and reflection and propose solutions to conflictive situations that require guiding ethical criteria.
Art, design and creativity	The minor in <i>Art, design and creativity</i> will teach you to develop innovative, reflective professional practices, close to sensitivity, with a critical sense, and social responsibility.
Contemporary history	The minor in <i>Contemporary history</i> will teach you about the historical processes that shaped the contemporary era from political, economic, social, and artistic perspectives.
Criminology	The minor in <i>Criminology</i> will allow you to enhance your professional profile through a combination of courses in criminology, public security, and related disciplines, such as law, psychology, and social sciences.

Culture and critical thinking	The minor in <i>Culture and critical thinking</i> will allow you to distinguish, interpret, and critique the social and cultural dynamics in relation to cultural phenomena of daily life, such as cinema, literature, media, and the digital world.
Negotiation and labor conflict	The minor in <i>Negotiation and labor conflict</i> will provide you with an updated vision of the work world that is focused on negotiation and labor disputes, for advising workers, unions, government, and international organizations, companies and business chambers.
Physical activity and health promotion	The minor in <i>Physical activity and health promotion</i> will provide you with tools and resources to generate lasting and autonomous habits of healthy lifestyle, practice of physical activity, recreation, and sports, which you can apply to your daily life or that of other people.
Data Science	The minor in <i>Data science</i> challenges students to transform data into relevant and valid information for decision-making and problem solving.
Society and politics	The minor in <i>Society and politics</i> will allow you to analyze and understand social and political phenomena that affect contemporary societies, such as development, environmental sustainability, political stability, democratic consolidation, violence, organized crime, and peace.

Digital Business	The minor in <i>Digital business</i> will teach you to create, manage, and transform companies using digital technologies and data analysis, as well as applying innovative and disruptive business models.
Entrepreneurship	If you are interested in running a business or developing it in the future, the minor in Entrepreneurship will provide you with the foundational knowledge to design, develop, and manage of businesses, both traditional and dynamic or innovative.
Healthcare policy and management	The minor in <i>Healthcare policy and management</i> will provide you with a global vision of the healthcare system and management tools for conducting health services with transformative leadership.
Human behavior	The minor in <i>Human behavior</i> will allow to better understand people's way of learning, thinking, feeling, acting, and empathizing with others. In addition, you will be able to delve into aspects that refer to spirituality and research in psychology.
Latin American studies	The minor in <i>Latin American studies</i> will teach you to develop your world vision in the context of Latin America and the Caribbean and will train you to perform professionally in the region.
Law	The minor in <i>Law</i> will allow you to learn the conceptual foundations of the discipline and delve into specific areas related to the professional career you wish to pursue.
