Application procedures

Once your university nominates you, we will contact you with further instructions. At that time, you will need to submit the following:

- Letter of support from home institution
- Official or unofficial Transcript
- Official or unofficial TOEFL/IELTS score

After acceptance, you will be asked to submit the following:

- Financial guarantee
- Passport copy
- Visiting International Student Information Form
