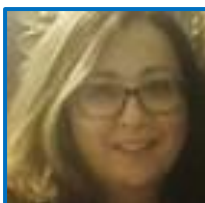


PAOLA COPPOLA

CARLA MONTESANO

PhD. Assistant Professor of General Pathology and Immunology at the Department of Biology of the University of Rome "Tor Vergata" and member of UNESCO Interdisciplinary Chair of Biotechnology & Bioethics.

She is the coordinator of STARBIOS2 and RESBIOS projects funded under the EU Horizon 2020 Framework Programme for Research and Innovation aimed to promote Responsible Research and Innovation in Biosciences.



She has a long specific track of research activities in the field of immunology of infectious diseases including HIV, Ebola and TB, and other immune-related disorders. She focused her activities on the miniaturization of immunoassay and development of specific expertise in immunoinformatics and on the analysis of the effects of plant food microRNAs on human health transferring the results to market products. Beside teaching of university courses of General Pathology and Immunology she is responsible for the course “Nutrition, Wellness and Sustainability” on Sustainable Science and Responsible Research and Innovation and participates in programs of dissemination of scientific culture in high schools and in the town districts.

DONATELLA GAVRILOVICH

Donatella Gavrilovich is Associate Professor of History of Theatre and Digital Technologies at the University of Rome ‘Tor Vergata’. She is a scholar interested in Russian theatre, set design, visual arts, dance of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries and in the digital cataloging of the theatrical performances. She was a member of the European Community for the ECLAP project, contributing as an expert to the European Portal EUROPEANA. Since 2012 she founded and directed the scientific publishing series entitled “Arti dello Spettacolo/Performing Arts” and, since January 2015, the online journal <http://www.artidellospettacolo-performingarts.com/> She is the coordinator of the International project (2013-2021) between the St. Petersburg State University ITMO (Russia) and the University ‘Tor Vergata’, concerning the application of new technologies to the Cultural Intangible Heritage. In 2016 the Russian-Italian team published a Virtual Museum, dedicated to the Russian actress Vera Komissarzhevskaya (<http://verakomina.ifmo.ru>). She is a member of EURODRAM-MEO in Paris, SEFR of University of Warwick and fellow of the CERCLE of University of Lorraine.

From 2014 to 2015 she conceived and designed the basic ontology of the Performance Knowledge Base (PKB), an innovative model for digital cataloguing online.

Among his most important publications: Profumo di Rus’. L’arte del teatro in Russia. Scritti d’artisti, pittori e critici 1860 - 1920, (1993); Nel segno del colore e del corpo. Il regista-scenografo Aleksandr Golovin (2011); Vera Komissarževskaja. Una donna "senza compromesso" La vita e l'opera dell'attrice russa dal 1899 al 1906 (2015). Her most recent work: Arts and Dance. Russian and Soviet Choreographers (2017).

ANXO SÁNCHEZ

Received his PhD in Theoretical Physics (with distinction) from Universidad Complutense de Madrid, Spain, in 1991. He then went on to a postdoctoral stay at Los Alamos National Laboratory, USA, as a Fulbright fellow.

Currently, he is full professor of Applied Mathematics at Universidad Carlos III de Madrid, where he founded the Interdisciplinary Group in Complex Systems (GISC, www.gisc.es) in 1996, and also an associated researcher with IBiDat at Universidad Carlos III de Madrid and BIFI at Universidad de Zaragoza.

He has co-authored almost 180 papers in prestigious international journals and has been an invited speaker at more than 50 national and international conferences. His research deals mostly with the applications of the physics of complex systems to social and biological sciences, and has contributed to the advancement of different fields ranging from economics to condensed matter physics through ecology and theoretical computer science. He has been the PI of 19 projects, with funding from H2020, the Spanish government, the Madrid regional government, Fundación BBVA, NATO and ESF.



ELÍAS SANZ

PhD. in Biological Sciences from the Complutense University of Madrid. Professor at the Carlos III University of Madrid and director of the Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU_UC3M-UAM).

Since 1997 he runs the Laboratory of Metric Information Studies (LEMI), where he develops his research activity in the fields of bibliometrics, scientometrics and evaluation of scientific activity. He has participated and directed a significant number of national, international and EU research projects.

He has published in numerous international journals, and directed more than 20 doctoral theses. He has been a member of expert committees in numerous evaluation agencies. He is currently a member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the Gadea Science Foundation.



TERESA MALO

Teresa Malo de Molina holds a degree in Hispanic Philology from the Complutense University of Madrid. He started in 1983 as a Library Assistant at the University of Salamanca. From 1985 to 1990 she was Head of the Golden Age Section at the National Library.

From 1990 to 1998 she was Head of Professional Coordination in the Library Coordination Unit of the CSIC. In 1998 she was Deputy Librarian at the Carlos III University of Madrid and, in June 2005, Technical Director of the National Library of Spain. In November 2007 he returned to the Carlos III University of Madrid, as Deputy Manager of Human Resources and Organization. Since May 2011, she holds the position of Director of the Library Service at the same university.

Nowadays, she is also the coordinator of the Open Access Working Group within REBIUN (Spanish Network of University Libraries), and is a member of the Monitoring Committee for the implementation of the Article 37 Dissemination in Open Access of the Law of Science, Technology and Innovation, coordinated by the FECYT, and is a member of the Open Science Working Group of the CRUE (Spanish Rector's Conference).

She is a graduate in Translation and Interpreting by the University of Salamanca and was granted a PhD in Translation by Universitat Jaume I (Castellón). She has also completed a Master's Degree in Digital Libraries and Information Services at Universidad Carlos III.

JOHAN ROORICK

Johan Rooryck is a researcher, journal editor, and committed advocate of Open Access publishing. He is Professor of French Linguistics at Leiden University in the Netherlands, where his main research interests lie in



the interaction between morphology, syntax, and semantics, and in the relation between language and core knowledge systems.

He has over 20 years' experience as an editor, first as the Executive Editor of *Lingua* (Elsevier) and since 2015 as the founder and Editor in Chief of the Fair Open Access journal *Glossa: a journal of general linguistics*. He is President of the Quality Open Access Market (QOAM), founding member and President of the Fair Open Access Alliance (FOAA), founding member of Mathematics in Open Access (MathOA) and Psychology in Open Access (PsyOA), founding member and President of Linguistics in Open Access (LingOA), and Member of the Academia Europaea.



LLUÍS ANGLADA

Nowadays he is Director of Open Science in the CSUC (Consortium of Services for the Universities of Catalonia); before, he was the director of the CBUC (Consortium of Catalan Academic Libraries) and director of the Catalonia Technical University Libraries.

He has been a member of several professional boards at the national and international level (SPARC Europe, LIBER, OCLC's Global Council) and also of publisher advisory councils (ProQuest, Wiley, Nature...) He has published about 40 articles and book chapters. Founder of the blogs BDig y Blok de Bid.



AGNÈS PONSATI

She has a degree in Hispanic Philology (University of Barcelona, 1986), a Diploma in Librarianship and Documentation from the same university (1987), and has been head of CSIC Unit of Information Resources for Research since 1994. The Unit manages one of the most important scientific library networks in Spain. Previously she worked at the Technical Department of Barcelona's University Library (1987-1990) and as automation manager at Catalanian CSIC libraries branch (1990-1993). Had also been Director of the Division of Digital Processes and Services at the Spanish National Library (2017-2018).

Specialist in automated library systems in distributed networks and in management and coordination of library services and collections at research hybrid-digital libraries. Responsible for the set up of CSIC Virtual Library and the management of the digital collections and all technological supporting tools. She has been involved in promoting OA among CSIC scientific community through CSIC Institutional Repository Digital. CSIC is a useful initiative to re-situate scientific libraries within the scholarly workflow.



She has published papers on technical management of library systems and collections in distributed environments and management of library services in the context of scientific and research libraries. She has taken part in several national and European projects on automation of document collections, catalogue conversion systems, bibliographic protocols, meta-search engines, and maximising the value of heritage collections by applying new technologies. She also has a wide expertise in publishing negotiations and licensing digital contents and has been member of several publishers' library advisory boards (ELSEVIER, SPRINGER, WILEY, IOP and BRILL). She is also member of the SCOAP3 Global Council representing the Spanish library consortia', member of the LIBER executive Board (2017) and SPARC Europe executive Board (2018).
