APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Nomination	Each University must send the students' nominations through the Unisi Nomination Form. The Incoming Mobility Team will provide the partner Universities with the link to the nomination form.
Nomination Deadline	May 31 st (for 1 st semester students) October 30 th (for 2 nd semester students)
Application Form	After the nomination, students will receive an access code to start the online application form. (Students do not have to register on "Segreteria online" before receiving the access code) After completing the application form, exchange students will receive an acceptance mail and practical information. The Incoming Mobility Team will send an acceptance letter to non EU students. The letter, electronically signed, will be sent to the Italian Consulate by certified mail (PEC) Students must apply for a study visa. Application Deadline	June 30th (for first semester students) November 30th (for second semester students)
UNISIPASS	During the application process students will receive by email their UNISIPASS: a username and a password which allows them to login into the Virtual Office (Segreteria online). Students must keep the UNISIPASS to have access to the UNISI digital services during the mobility period.
