Eligibility	Students must have a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 2.75 out of 4.0 GPA and be in good disciplinary standing.
English Proficiency	<p>All non-native English speakers must have sufficient English language proficiency for successfully completing academic work at UMaine. English language proficiency is considered sufficient at a minimum Test of English as a Second Language (TOEFL) score of 550 iTP (paper) or 79 iBT (internet) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) 6.5 composite score.</p> <p>Students who fall below these levels will be enrolled at the UMaine Intensive English Institute for ESL courses or a combination of ESL and academic courses based on the student's proficiency level.</p> <p>Students who do not submit an exam score at the time of application will be required to take an English language placement test upon arrival at UMaine.</p>
ESL Information	The Intensive English Institute (IEI) at UMaine can accept students from exchange partners for summer and semester programs. Students who do not meet the TOEFL requirements for a full time academic program can enroll at the IEI. Students can take only ESL courses, or a combination of both ESL and academic courses based on their proficiency level. IEI tuition is waived for exchange partners.

Academic fields	All departments are open to exchange applications except Nursing. Exchange students can register for any course that has available spaces and the student meets the prerequisites.

Course Registration	Undergraduate Level: Students must be enrolled full-time in <i>at least</i> 12 credit hours and a maximum of 15 credits which is 4-5 courses. Graduate Level: Students must be enrolled in <i>at least</i> 6 credit hours and a maximum of 9 credits which is 2-3 courses.
Academic advisor	The Study Abroad Advisor liaises with academic departments.
Proof of Financial ability	2018-2019 costs (Fall 2018 and Spring 2019): One semester: \$7,536; Academic year: \$15,038.
Housing	Campus housing fills quickly. Exchange students are strongly encouraged to apply for housing by May 1 for the fall semester. Spring housing is more readily available. Available housing: standard double room with shared bathroom facilities or self-catered housing in campus apartments is available. http://www.umaine.edu/housing/
Accommodation cost	Double Room: \$2,686 - 2,952/semester; Single room \$3,292-3,792 Meal plan: \$2,432 - 2,832/semester. Meal plan is not required in self-catered apartments. Options to purchase meal blocks available. http://umaine.edu/housing/room-board-rates/
Additional Costs	Books & Supplies: \$425/semester Health Insurance: \$2,502 (year), \$1,268(semester), home country insurance acceptable Personal & Misc: \$575/semester
