Application Process	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The partner university selects its outgoing students and informs the Communauté UGA of their candidates (nomination) by April 1st (for S1 and FY) or September 1st (for S2). 2. The partner university provides its students with the Communauté UGA Exchange Students application information. 3. The selected students will receive an individual email in which they will be explained the procedure to be followed. 4. The students apply to their host institution which evaluates their application. 5. The partner university and the student will be kept informed of the outcome of this process.

Is on-campus housing available for exchange students? What is the application process?	<p>Housing is available but on-campus housing is not guaranteed. Exchange students will be provided with the housing application link in their offer/admission package.</p> <p>Since 2017 there has been an increase in the housing demand which has made it more complicated for us to respect the students' housing choices. We are currently working on solutions to solve this issue and thank you and your students for your understanding.</p> <p>We strongly recommend the students to apply for housing as soon as they receive the acceptance letter in order not to miss the housing application deadline.</p>
